Ziana's pupils go green

BIRMINGHAM schoolchildren have been getting stuck into a mammoth pile of rubbish and hundreds of worms.

Youngsters from Kings Heath Primary School met with West Midlands 14-year-old climate change champion Ziana

Kotadia, at the Kitchen Garden Cafe, to find out how to reduce their carbon footprints.

Ziana, a pupil at King Edward Camp Hill School, showed the seven to 10-year-olds how to sort rubbish for recycling and demonstrated how to

use a wormery to create compost from leftover food.

She said: "It's so important to get the message about climate change across to a young audience – after all, they're the ones who are going to have to deal with the consequences."
