### Standard of Attainment Grades

Student work is assessed regularly during the year in each subject. Once a term a holistic grade is determined; this grade is based on all the work a student has completed to date during years 7 - 9. During Key Stage 3 the students acquire the skills, knowledge and understanding that is needed in preparation for GCSE study.

Reference to these will also provide specific subject information about what the students need to master in order to achieve a higher grade. Students' grades should improve during Key Stage 3 so that they are ready to study their GCSE subjects in Year 10.

The Key Stage 3 grades are not equivalent to GCSE grades and it is likely that students who have achieved grade 7 at the end of Y9 will not achieve as highly at the start of Y10.

### **Expected Grade Matrix**

The below matrix highlights how students will be working towards developing the skills, knowledge and understanding in preparation for GCSE study. The majority of students will achieve end of year grades within the indicated range.

### **Progress**

The progress of a student is categorised as 1 of the 3 descriptions: above expectations, in line with expectations or below expectations.

expectations (+)	the best of their ability and/or they have improved by more than one grade since the last

In line with	Student progress is currently in line with expectations if they are doing the majority of what is
expectations (=)	asked of them to the best of their ability and/or they have improved by one grade since the last
	report.
Below	Student progress is currently below expectations if they are regularly not completing work to
expectations (-)	an appropriate standard and/or their grades are not improving as the year progresses.

### Aspects of Learning

Students are awarded a colour coded grade "Excellent, Good, Satisfactory or Poor" on the following criteria:

- Knowledge and Understanding
- Contribution to Lessons
- Organisation
- Attitude to Learning
