You will be studying 2 set texts during the course - "Othello" by Shakespeare and "Frankenstein" by Nick Dear. The text for "Othello" is readily available online and it would be beneficial to you to read this and become familiar with the plot. You may also wish to research some of the history/context of Shakespeare's world to help you understand the original performance conditions.

The playtext of "Frankenstein" will not be available online - however you will be able to use the internet to familiarise yourself with the original novel's plot/text on which the play is based (the novel was written by Mary Shelley).

As part of the performance unit of the course you will be studying the practitioners Steven Berkoff and Bertolt Brecht. Use the internet to look at the background of their works and find out any details you can about their theatrical style and key features.
