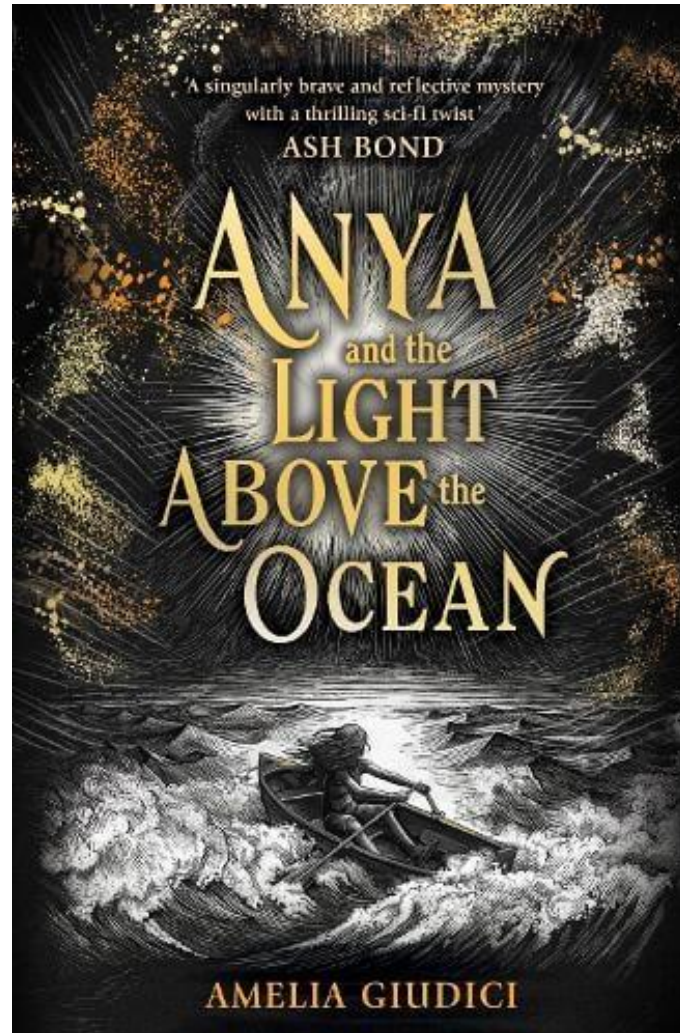
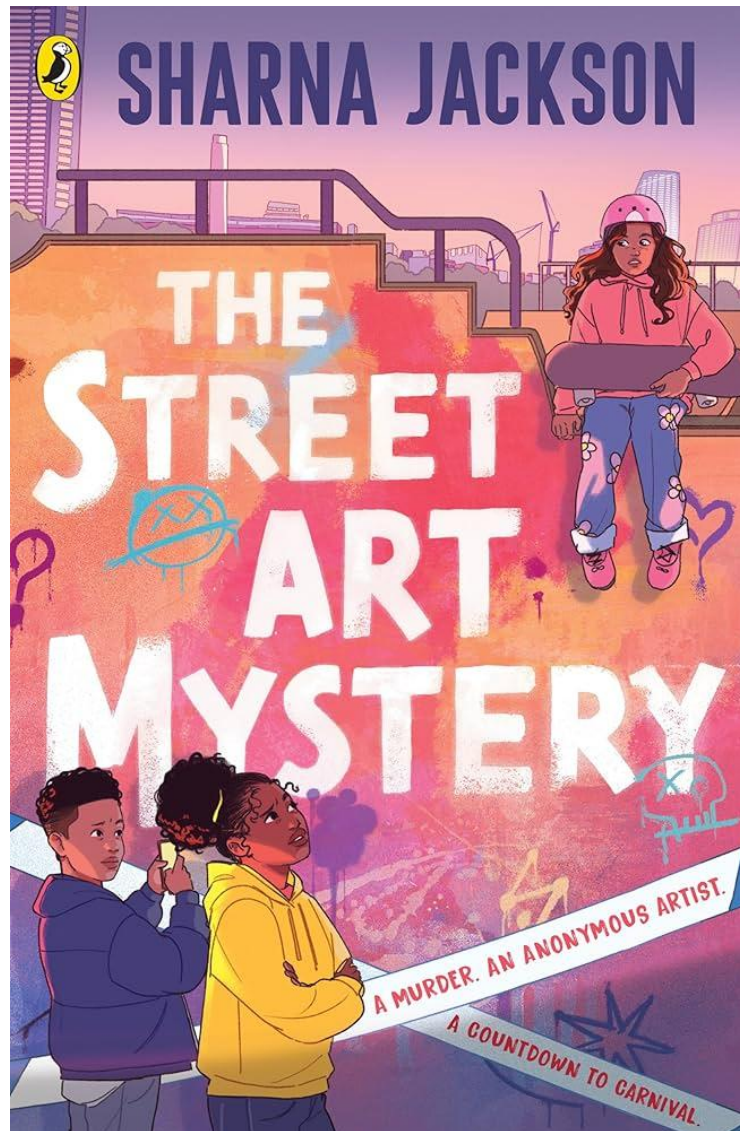


KS3 Book of the Month – September

KS3 Book of the Month – October



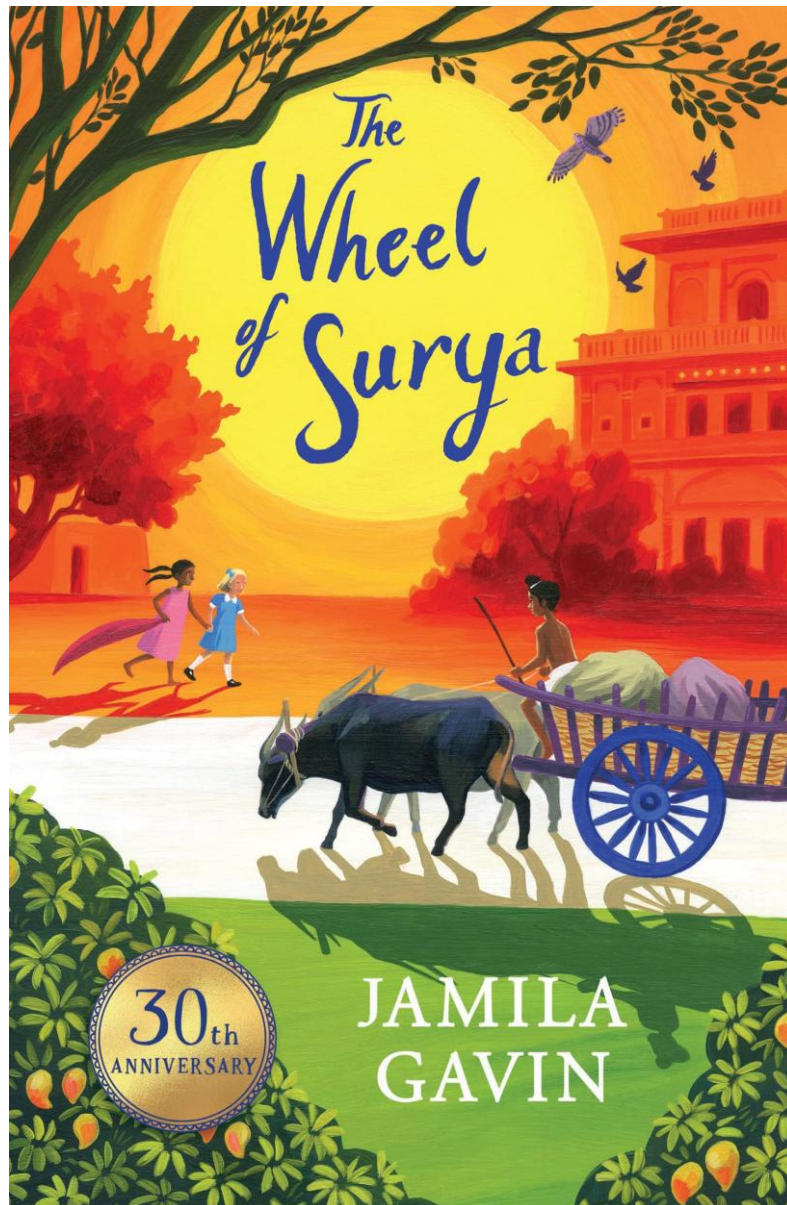

KS3 Book of the Month – November



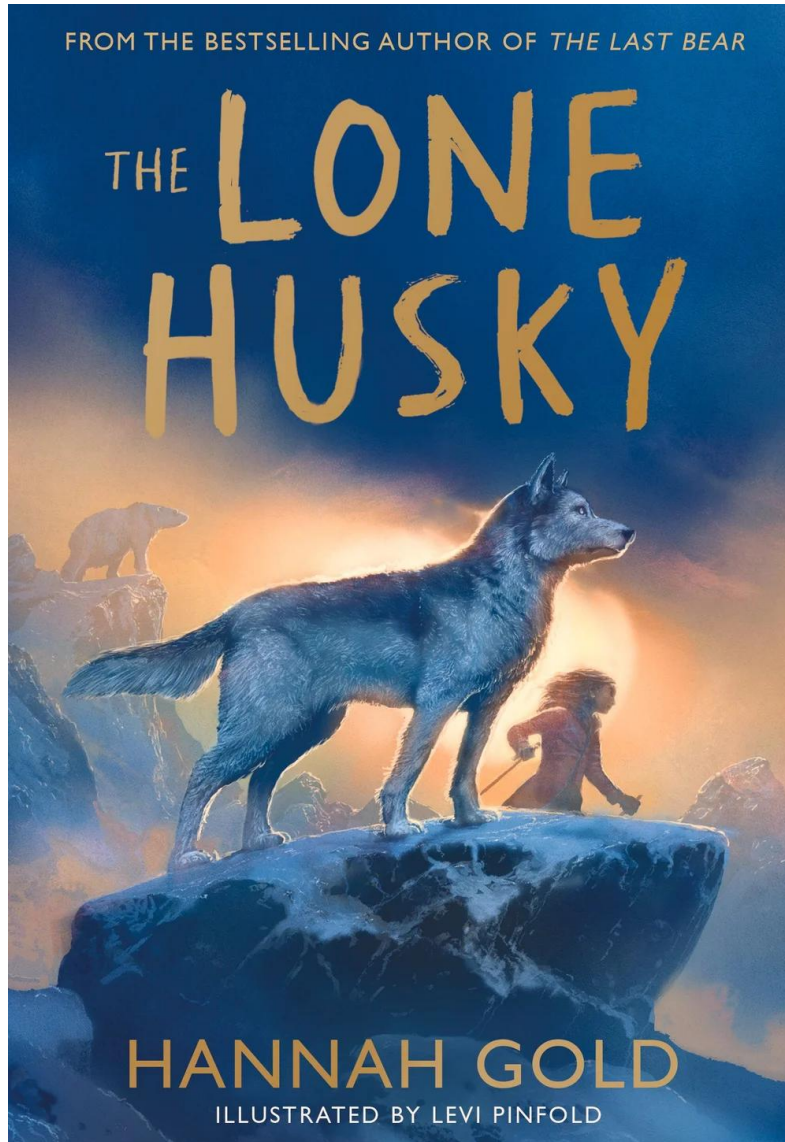

KS3 Book of the Month – December



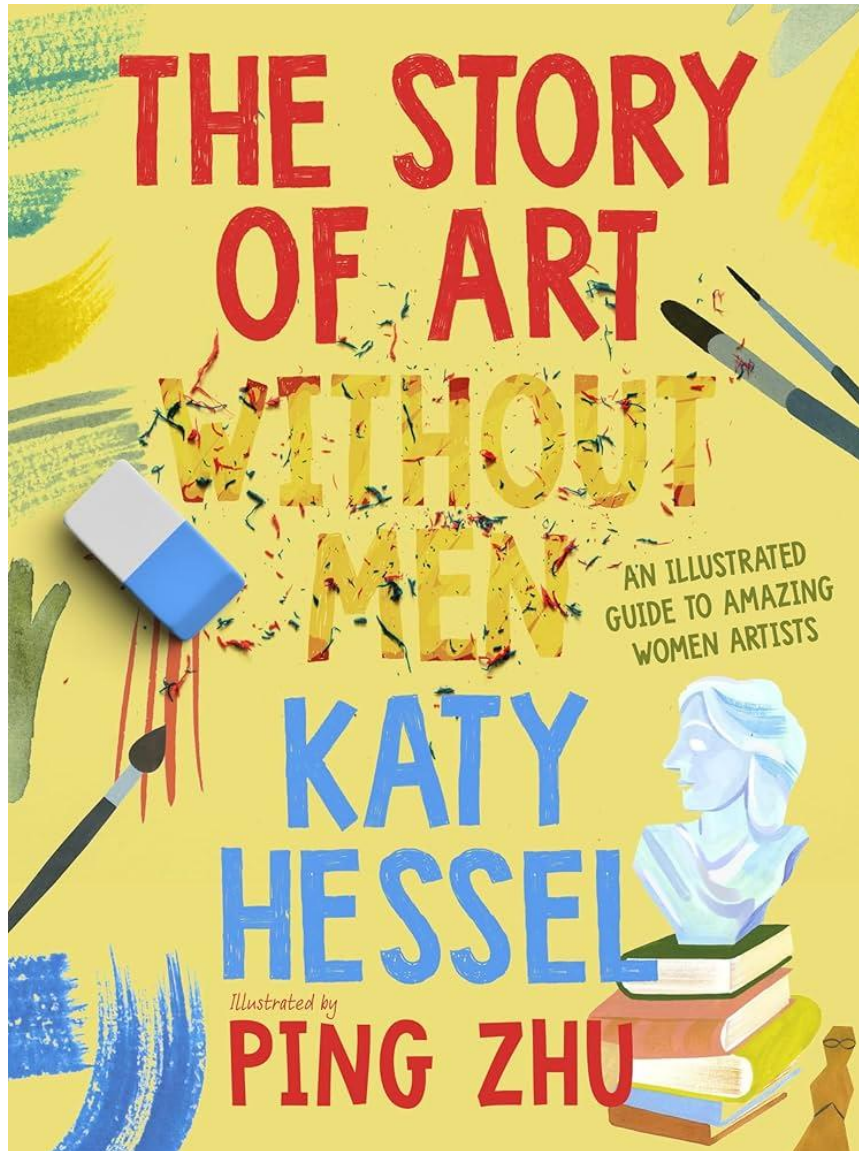

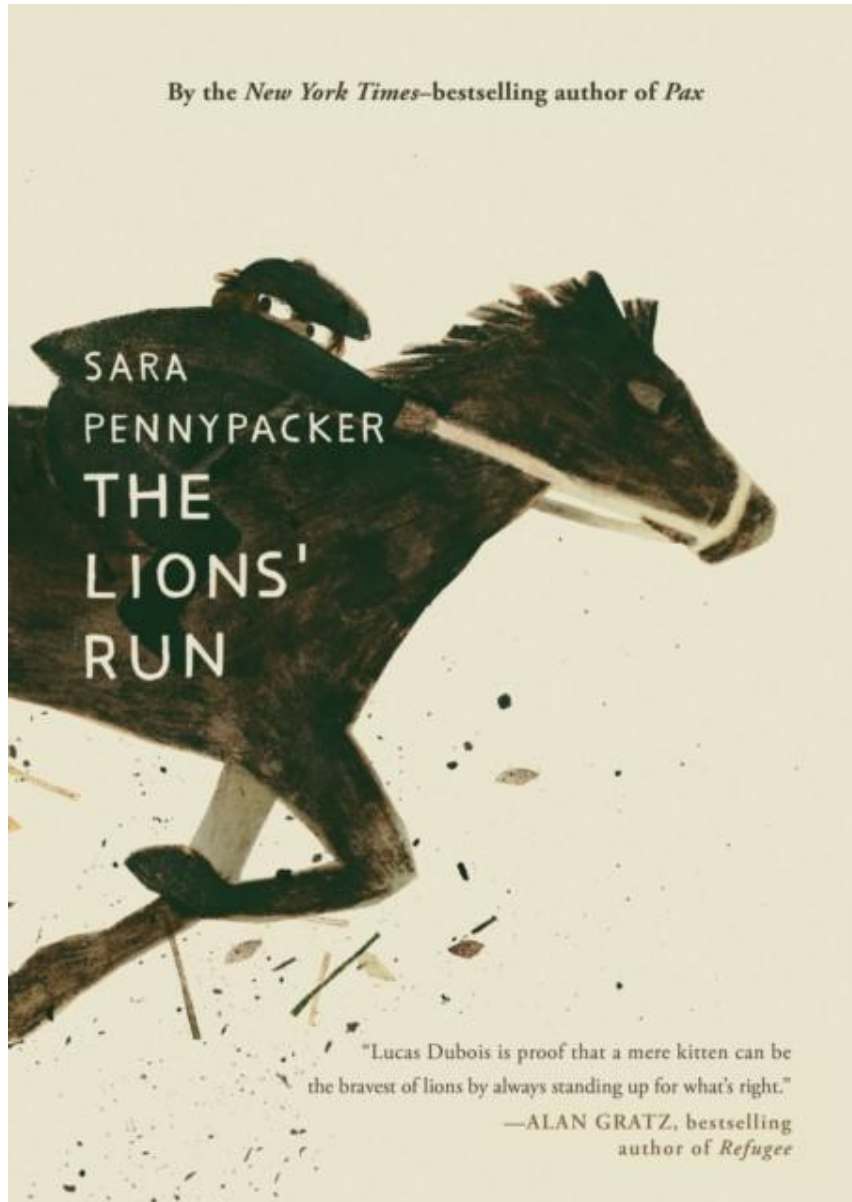
KS3 Book of the Month – March

KS3 Book of the Month – April



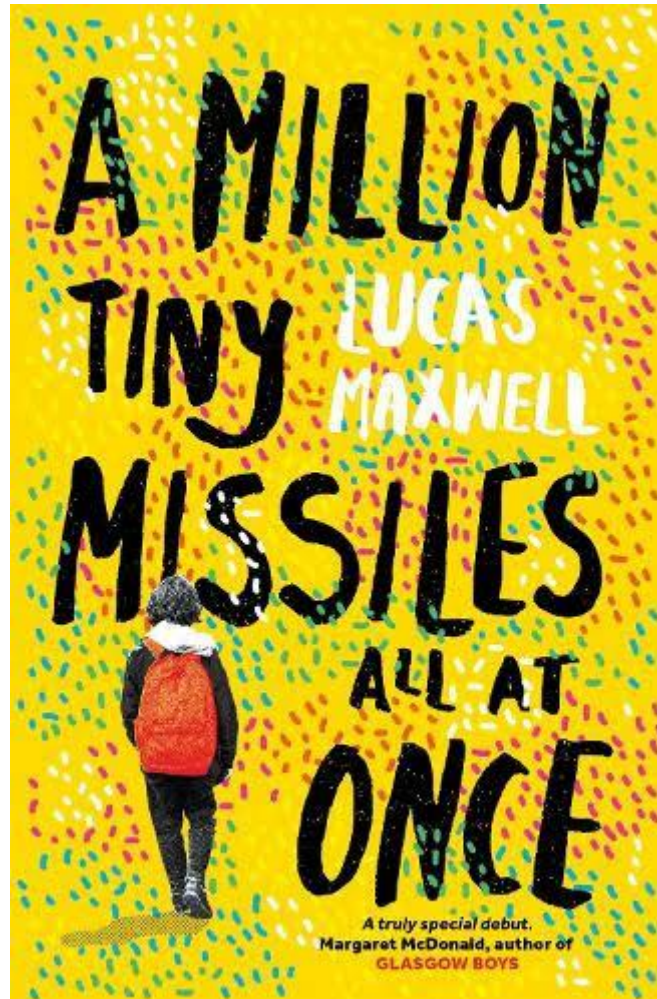
An incredible WWII animal rescue adventure, about an orphan who discovers unexpected courage when he becomes involved with the Resistance.

KS3 Book of the Month – May



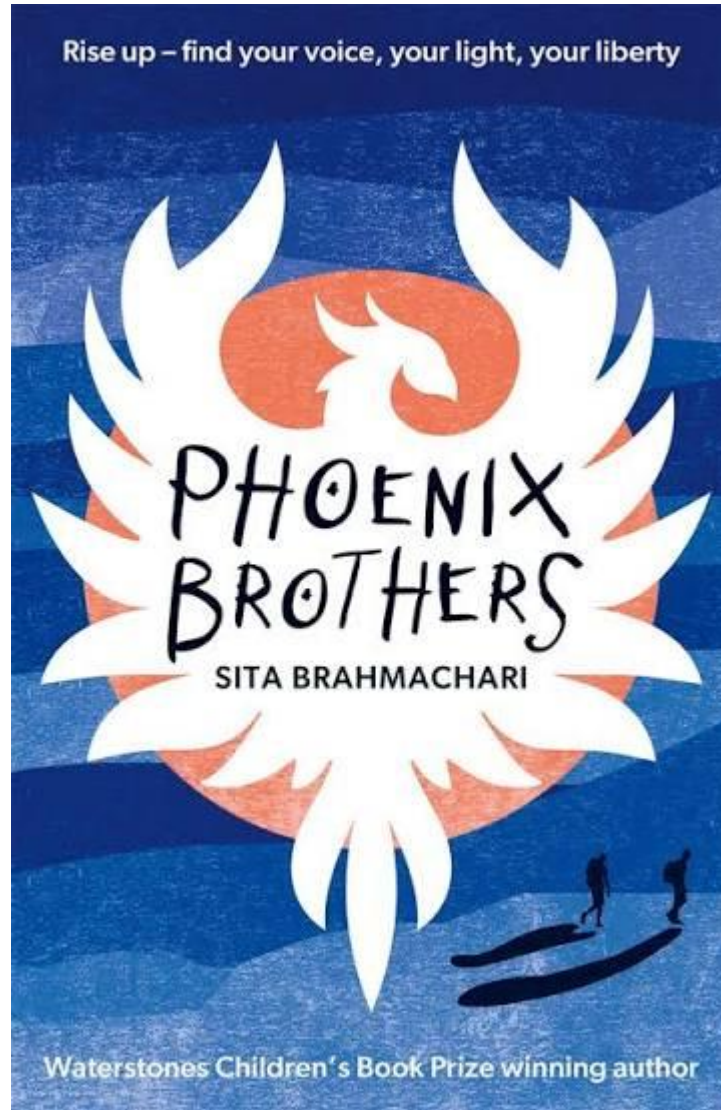
