ENRICHMENT WEEK

Enrichment week has been an annual event for several years at Camp Hill Girls. Below are some of the key trips, activities and events students have taken part in previously. Enrichment Week will take place Mon 22nd - Fri 26th June 2026.

KEY STAGE 3

In Year 7 students take part in STEAM, creative writing and Art workshops. They also have the opportunity to attend a residential trip with their peers. The purpose of the visit is to enable students to work on a variety of cross curricular group and teamwork activities all based at Condover Hall, Shropshire. At Condover Hall, fully trained and qualified instructors, with the support of school staff, provide instruction in a full programme of activities in a safe, controlled and secure environment. Students can also take part in the Bikeability scheme throughout the week.

In Year 8 there is a trip to Dovedale to work on their team work and explore the outdoors. Students will also have the opportunity to attend creative writing classes, enjoy a murder mystery activity and participate in a Drama Workshop. In 2026, we are excited to announce our inaugural Big Camp Hill Camp Out for Year 8 students! More details of this to follow soon.

Year 9 students take part in a range of activities throughout the week involving fashion design, the challenge carousel and an amazing opportunity to visit Oxford. Whilst in Oxford students will attend the Pitts River Museum, National History Museum and Keble College's Open Day. Later in the week students will add another fascinating visit to their repertoire with a trip to the National Memorial Arboretum.



KEY STAGE 4

Year 10 students will take part in a range of activities and experiences throughout their Enrichment Week. Starting with Careers Interviews, students will gain the experience of a real-life interview, helping them to refine their communication skills. Students will also visit Aston University, where they will receive information on the benefits and barriers to Higher Education, along with a tour of the university campus.

During the week, there will be a “pick and mix” day where students can choose three sessions that interest them (ideally something they haven’t tried before) such as musical theatre, jewellery making, and crochet.

A highlight of Year 10’s Enrichment Week will be the organisation and hosting of the popular “Senior Citizens’ Party.” This event involves inviting members of the local community into school for a celebration. Students will take the lead in planning and organising the party.

The week will culminate in a visit to Drayton Manor, a perfect opportunity to conquer fears, relax with peers, and enjoy a well-deserved, thrill-seeking adventure.



KEY STAGE 5

Year 12 students will have the opportunity to take part in a week of work experience during Enrichment Week.

There will be workshops available in school for students who need support with their UCAS personal statements. These sessions will be run and supported by experienced members of staff.

Students will also have the opportunity to assist with the setup and running of Sports Day, as well as other workshops for Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4. These activities will allow them to demonstrate and develop their leadership skills.
