






## ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

### **ENRICHMENT WEEK**





Enrichment Week takes place week beginning Monday 24th June 2024 and is an annual event at Camp Hill Girls. Students enjoy an amazing and varied programme of enrichment and extracurricular activities, aimed at encouraging personal skills away from the classroom.

#### **KEY STAGE 3**

In Year 7 students take part in STEAM workshops, XXXXXXXX They also have the opportunity to attend a residential trip with their peers. The purpose of the visit is to enable students to work on a variety of cross curricular group and teamwork activities all based at Condover Hall, Shropshire. At Condover Hall, fully trained and qualified instructors, with the support of school staff, provide instruction in a full programme of activities in a safe, controlled and secure environment. Students can also take part in the Bikeability scheme throughout the week.

In Year 8 there is daily activities to Dovedale to work on their team work and explore the outdoors. Students will also have the opportunity to attend creative writing classes, enjoy a murder mystery activity and attend an Apprenticeship lecture from our very own staff, to inspire and educate students on future careers, opportunities and pathways.

Year 9 students will take part in a range of activities throughout the week involving fashion design, the challenge carousel and an amazing opportunity to visit Oxford. Whilst in Oxford students will attend the Pitts River Museum, National History Museum and Keble College's Open Day. Later in the week students will add another fascinating museum to their repertoire with a trip to the National Memorial Arboretum.













#### **KEY STAGE 4**

Year 10 students will take part in a range of activities and experiences throughout their enrichment week. Starting with Careers Interviews, this will give students the experience of a real life interview, helping them perfect their communication skills. Students will attend Aston University with information on benefits and barriers to Higher Education and a tour of the University campus.

During the week there is a "pick and mix" day where students will have the choice to chose three sessions that they find interesting, ranging from musical theatre to willow weaving.

An exciting part of Year 10's enrichment week will be the organisation and running of the successful "Senior Citizen's Party". This involves inviting some of our local community into school and hosting a party. Students will be at the forefront of the planning and organisation of this event.

Finishing off the fulfilled week with an opportunity to visit Drayton Manor, a way to fight fears, enjoy some down time with peers and enjoy a well deserved, thrill seeking adventure.
