## GCSE Options (Year 9 into Year 10)

Students make their initial choice of GCSE subjects in the Spring Term after the Year 9 Options Evening and Progress Evening for Parents & Carers have taken place.

## A Level Options (Year 11 into Year 12)

Students make their initial choice of Y12 subjects in the Spring Term after individual careers interviews, the Sixth Form Open Evening, Mock examinations, the Year 11 Progress Evening for Parents & Carers and an individual conversation with a Senior member of staff have taken place.

Students should also talk to their Subject Teachers, Form Tutors and if necessary their Head of Year who will support them in the decision making process. Students have the opportunity to ask questions about the process during PSHE lessons.

Once the courses have started students should recognise that the change to GCSE and/or A Levels may not always be straightforward and that they should talk to their Subject Teachers and their Form Tutor about any difficulties they encounter **prior** to requesting a change of subject.

The process for requesting a change is essentially the same for both year groups as explained below, however please note the slightly different dates.
